



Fortunately the vaccines are coming. I would encourage everyone who can, to get a vaccination. This will help to get our Lodge fully open as soon as possible







TROOP 44 JANUARY UPDATE

Another month gone by, another set of meetings and events completed, and boy did we have fun. Starting off the month, we had a pet show and tell where all of the Scouts showed the others their pets. We had dogs, cats, even a bird! Following that we had a short presentation on First Aid, and after that breakout rooms where we had our first SPL riddle. Up next on the February events list was Scout Sunday, which looked a little different than normal. Typically all scouts are required to attend Scout Sunday as part of being an active scout, but this year, scouts were encouraged to go to whichever church they regularly attended. In doing so, we lived out the twelfth point of the Scout Law, which is to be reverent. The next event was the meeting the next day, where we welcomed Cub Scouts to join our meeting in an Troop Open House. As part of our entertainment for the night, we played a BSA Kahoot that focused on facts about Troop 44's history, as well as BSA's history. After that came a quick history lesson on Troop 44, then question time. The next week, we did not have a meeting, but we did have a Board of Review, where a scout ranked up to Star. 
