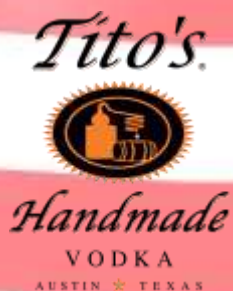

Troop 44 and 4044 News

The past month or so of activity in Troop 44 and 4044 has revolved largely around Camp Chawanakee, the summer camp that our troop attends each year at Shaver Lake. In the meetings leading up to departure, our troop focused on a variety of activities relating to Camp Chawanakee. These including learning skills for flag ceremonies, like marching, executing crisp turns, and raising flags. In addition, our troop practiced some classic Chawanakee songs, including “One Fat Hen”, “Froggy”, and “Columbo”. Among scouts at Chawanakee, these songs are a sort of silly flex (especially “One Fat Hen”, which involves a ridiculous amount of memorization. Reciting the whole thing is quite a feat). However, these songs also demonstrate scout spirit, which was a key focus for our troop this year.

Scout spirit is a bit tricky to define, and part of the fun of scouting is discovering what it means to you specifically. However, at Chawanakee, a troop that embodies scout spirit is generally defined as exemplifying the points of both the Scout Oath and Scout Law. These include being helpful, friendly, kind, cheerful, and clean. And, of course, screaming ridiculous songs at the top of your lungs doesn't hurt when it comes to scout spirit.

Each night at Camp Chawanakee, a “thumbstick” is awarded to the troop that the camp judges feel has best exemplified scout spirit that day. The winner is decided based on a grading scale that measures everything from morale to camp cleanliness. In the past couple of years, our troop has struggled to win the thumbstick once at Chawanakee, so this year, the head of our youth leadership, Koen Bales, made it a priority to improve our scout spirit, with the hope of winning the thumbstick at least once. We put in a lot of effort, and the result was incredible. Everyone pitched in to try to get our scout spirit as high as possible. Mornings are often very rushed at camp, between breakfast and flags, both of which have to happen before classes start at 8:45. However, our entire troop worked hard during the small amount of free time they had in the morning to get our camp looking spotless. People also gave their all during the variety of songs performed by our troop during flags. In addition, several scouts made further contributions by volunteering for camp-wide flag ceremonies, and giving up their free time to work on camp improvements, which included building new trails and creating different lashing structures like a pull-up bar, a basketball hoop, and a soccer goal. Finally, our entire troop maintained an incredibly positive spirit throughout the entire week, whether they were taking merit badge classes, shivering through astronomy night, or paddling across the lake in a canoe.

As a result of all this hard work, our troop managed to win the thumbstick not once, but twice during our stay at Chawanakee. Each time a troop wins the thumbstick, they have the chance to decorate it. The thumbstick starts out as a normal stick, but by the end of the week, it's practically a work of art. Our troop choose to turn it into a hotdog the first time we got it. The second time we won the thumbstick, we decked it out in Hawaiian gear in honor of Hawaiian Day at camp.

Winning the thumbstick twice at camp was a huge accomplishment for our troop, and a huge improvement from last year. Hopefully, we can carry this momentum into the next year of camp, and improve even more.

Before I finish this article, I want to give a couple shout-outs to people in our troop. One of the things I really like about Camp Chawanakee it the opportunity it presents to try new things. And this year, there were a lot of new things to try. So I'd like to give a big hand to everyone who participated in the Polar Bear (where you wake up at six a.m. to jump in the lake), the Iron Bear (where you wake up at six a.m. to run a mile, and then jump in the lake), the Mile Swim (which is exactly what it sounds like, except at six a.m. in a freezing cold lake), and Canoe Outpost (which involves paddling across the lake in a canoe, spending a night on the other side in nothing but a sleeping bag, and then paddling back - arriving back at camp at, just about, six a.m.). To all the people who participated in these activities this year - congratulations, you guys are hardcore.

And with that, Troop 44 and 4044 have put another year of Camp Chawanakee in the history books. Between the incredible scout spirit and double thumbstick victories, this will certainly be a year to remember. But, with a little luck, we'll do even better next year - as long as we lock in, focus, and remember to sing "One Fat Hen" at the top of our lungs.



First Responders Recognition/Awards Dinner

In grateful appreciation for service to our local heroes, the Redwood City Elks Lodge hosted a recognition awards dinner for San Mateo County First Responders on July 19. One of our own, Eric Bunzel, was recognized for his inordinate service as Fire/Engineer Paramedic for Menlo Fire District.

Erik is a long-time resident of San Mateo County and also a San Mateo Elk. He has been very involved in operational and benevolent activities throughout his career with Menlo Fire. He has participated in the 'line medic' program for many years, where he deploys to large fires throughout California, serving and protecting the fire personnel assigned to the incident. He also coordinates the Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus program for Menlo Fire, which takes a significant amount of additional time and effort beyond his role as an Engineer/Medic.

In early 2023, Erik was assigned to Engine 3 in Atherton, when they responded to a structure fire in Redwood City. Dispatchers and law enforcement informed Engine 3 upon their arrival, of an unaccounted for resident trapped inside the fire building. Working with his engine crew and personnel from the Redwood City Fire Department, Erik located the victim and extricated him from the building. The victim was transported to Stanford University Hospital with life threatening injuries from the fire. Erik embodies all that the Menlo Park Fire Protection District stands for.

We thank Erik for his service to our community and are proud to call him an 1112'er!
