My name is Lynda Stuppi. My Mom and Dad used to take my brother and I to enjoy warm afternoon swims and activities at the Elks pool and Lodge.. We lived in Westlake at that time. My Dad, Dr. Harold Torkelson, also enjoyed the sun in San Mateo, so he joined the Elks Lodge and bought a home in Burlingame!! We were all so happy to live in the sun and swim!

My brother and I went to Mills High School. My brother died in 1967. That was the reason Mom and Dad purchased 4 burial plots at Skylawn Memorial Park, off Hwy 92, at Skyline Blvd. They were able to personally choose their four plots facing the Ocean, in the **Elks Lodge cemetery area!** My Mom is in one and my brother in the other one. My dad chose to be cremated and I no longer live near San Mateo. Consequently, we have 2 burial plots to sell, within the Elks area.

Since we were an Elk's Lodge family, I thought this should be my first choice to connect with good people who might also have relatives at the Skylawn Memorial Park, and be interested in 2 plots themselves. The area is easily accessed. When you enter the first gate on the left, that is the entry into the Elks' area. Our 2 plots are just off a little road winding around the grounds, and overlooking the ocean view! Right below our plots is the Crematory area.

It is my hope and desire that the Elks Lodge will have a way to 'announce' this opportunity to their greater membership. It would be a blessing to me, to know other Elk members will be next to my Mom and brother.

Between \$6,000 and \$9,500 is available to every Lodge, and we want to ensure that you receive every dollar to serve your community.

WEARING THE RIBBON

October 23-31 is Red Ribbon Week, a time of advocacy and awareness of the harm that drugs and alcohol can cause communities. Along with the work done by the Elks Drug Awareness Program, many Lodges use grants to prevent substance abuse through education and recovery support.

Donaldsonville, La., Lodge No. 1153 uses a Gratitude Grant to hold a Drive into Recovery event. The Lodge works with community partners that provide information for those who may be exposed to Fentanyl and resources for the safe destruction of prescription drugs. Since many of the attendees also experience hunger, the Lodge uses some of the funds to distribute food boxes.

Portsmouth, N.H., Lodge No. 97 used a Beacon Grant to partner with Step Up Parents, an organization that provides support to caregivers who have taken custody of children due to parental substance abuse. The Portsmouth Lodge provided resources to the organization and hosted an event for the community with experts and local politicians.

On the latest episode of the Midday Minute, Jim and Debbie share exciting news about a new bonus for the Gratitude Grant! The Fundraising Increase Bonus will offer an additional \$500 if the Lodge raises 10% more than the previous year. This bonus will be available starting in grant year 2024-25, meaning that your Lodge can start working now to qualify for a Gratitude Grant of up to \$4,000 next year!

A report will soon be posted so the Lodge can track its progress toward that 10% increase. With that, the Lodge will know exactly how much it needs to raise to receive this fourth Gratitude Grant bonus.




