#### **BRIEF HISTORY OF BOCCE**

Bocce ball, also known simply as bocce, is a traditional Italian sport with a rich history that spans centuries. The game's origins can be traced back to ancient Rome. It was played by soldiers, commoners and statesman alike. Over the years, bocce has evolved and spread beyond Italy, becoming a popular pastime in many countries around the world.

The roots of bocce ball can be found in games played in the Roman Empire which ran approximately 1000 years from 753BC to 476AD. Soldiers often engaged in a sport called 'bucce' which involved throwing a stone at a target. This early form of the game eventually transformed into what we know as bocce. The word "bocce" itself is believed to have originated from the Latin word "bottia" meaning boss or ball.

The decline of the Roman Empire resulted in a decline in the popularity of bocce. However, the game never disappeared entirely and continued to be played in various forms throughout the centuries. It experienced a resurgence during the Renaissance, 1500 to 1600, where it gained favor among the nobility in Italy. The game became associated with leisure and social gatherings played in the gardens of aristocratic estates.
