Troop 44 and 4044 News

August is well-known in our area as the "Back to School" month. It's a busy time that involves meeting new teachers and reconnecting with old friends, settling back into another year at the desk and trying out for after school sports. Amidst all this frantic energy, Troop 44 tries to dial things back a little in order to not add to the stress. However, a fair bit of stuff still happened this month, especially in the week and half we had before school kicked off for most people.

August is the month where we typically do our yearly planning in Greenbar, so we kicked off the eighth month of the year with that. On August 12, we held our Greenbar Reward Trip, a combination planning and celebratory trip. Greenbar is the term we use to refer to the group of scouts who run our troop. It consists of our Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, and representatives of each patrol, as well as a few other roles, including a scribe, quartermaster, and librarian. Greenbar convenes every month to plan the meetings for the next month. In August, they plan the trips for the entire next year.

We held this year's Greenbar Reward Trip at the College of San Mateo. After a good couple of hours and a lunch of pizza, we came up with what is, in my opinion, a phenomenal roster of trips. I won't list them all here, but some highlights were the two backpacking trips we got on the calendar, a multiple day game of capture the flag, and a trip to camporee, an event put on by our local Scouts BSA council that allows troops to compete with each other.

After finishing up our planning, we headed to Top Golf in San Jose, where we enjoyed an afternoon of golfing (or attempting to golf, as most of us had never played before). Even though our scores were rather low, we still all had a great time, and it was a fun reward for the dedication that all the Greenbar members put in during their terms.

A couple weeks after school started, we held our August trip, a visit to Lake McSwain Water Park. This structure is probably best described as a giant, inflatable obstacle course - in the middle of a lake. Its features include several different slides, two high dive platforms, an inflatable race course, a teeter totter, and, perhaps most infamously, the Blob.

The Blob is perhaps the most creative and intense feature at Lake McSwain. Essentially, it's an airbag below a 20 foot platform. One person jumps down on to the Blob, then crawls to the edge of the airbag. Then, another person jumps, inflating the airbag, and launching the first person into the air. When the launcher is roughly the same weight as the person who was being launched, the Blob is fun and scary. When the launcher is much bigger than the kid on the end of the airbag, or when two people launched one guy, the Blob is absolutely terrifying. Trust me, feeling a sharp jolt and then suddenly finding yourself 15 feet in the air is not at all pleasant. With weight imbalances like these, we saw a wide variety of unintentional tricks off the Blob, including front flips, back flips, and belly flops. Unfortunately, most of these also resulted in awkward landings, and a number of us were nursing bruises after the trip. I think we could all agree that getting launched of the Blob was worth a couple of bruises, though.

After a good five or so hours at the water park, we dried off and headed up to our campsite, which was conveniently only a couple hundred feet from the lake. Well most of us set up our tents, a few scouts began to prepare dinner. All seemed well...until the clouds started rolling in. Before we knew what was happening, we found ourselves dealing with the edge of the Hurricane Hillary storm system. The rain was starting to come down, and people were rushing to get rainflys on their tents, as we had not been expecting a storm that night.

Then, the first bolt of lightning struck. Generally, Troop 44 camps rain or shine, and we were planning to try and ride this storm out, but BSA policy dictates that we cannot camp through lightning. So, depressed, we quickly packed up our gear and threw it in cars. At this point, our scouts had just finished cooking, so rather than waste a meal, we decided to scarf down our tacos under the shaded picnic tables in our site. Then everyone got in cars, and we rolled out. We got back to the Elk's Lodge at 11:00 pm that night.

Needless to say, the Lake McSwain Water Park trip was a bit of an adventure. However, I think everyone learned at least one lesson from that trip: How to adapt to change. Change is a big part of our world, and the ability to adapt to it extends far beyond unprecedented weather on camping trips. I don't think that's the only thing we learned on the Lake McSwain trip though. For some of us, this adventure taught us a valuable lesson that is probably far more deeply ingrained into our brains than anything about change: Never, ever let your friend who's twice as old and twice as big as you launch you off the Blob.


