

GREETINGS:

The Grand Exalted Ruler, by and with the approval of the Board of Grand Trustees of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America, acting upon authority given him under Article 3, Section 6, Grand Lodge Constitution, does hereby proclaim that the next session of the membership of the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will convene in Austin, Texas with the opening ceremonies and meetings held at the Austin Convention Center, 500 E. Cesar Chavez St, Austin, TX 78701 on Sunday, June 30, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. The opening business session will convene in the Austin Convention Center at 8:00 Monday morning, July 1, 2024, at which session the election of Officers for the ensuing year will be held. Business sessions will continue thereafter at 8:00 a.m. on July 2, and 3, 2024, until the business to come before the sessions is finished.

The Hilton Austin on 500 E. 4th St, Austin, TX 78701 and the JW Marriott on 110 E. 2nd St, Austin, TX 78701 have been selected as Co-Headquarters hotel for the 159th Grand Lodge Session. Brief History of Bocce Part 2

By the 19th century, bocce's popularity continued to grow, and it had become a common pastime for many Italian Communities. The rules and regulations were formalized, contributing to its widespread appeal. Bocce courts began to appear in public spaces, allowing people of all backgrounds to enjoy the game.

Italian immigrants brought bocce with them as they traveled to different parts of the world including the United States. Bocce courts took root in immigrant communities, becoming a staple of Italian American culture. Bocce leagues and clubs formed, providing a sense of community and camaraderie.

The sport's international recognition received a significant boost in the 20th century when in 1936, bocce was included in the official events in the Summer Olympics held in Berlin. Although it is not included in the 2024 regular Summer Olympics it is a sport the 2024 Special Olympics.

The formation of international bocce organizations helped standardize the rules and promote the sport on a global scale. Bocce competitions and championships became regular events, attracting participants from various countries.

The simplicity of bocce, with its basic objective of throwing balls close to a target, contributes to its widespread appeal. It is a game that transcends age, skill level and cultural boundaries. Bocce ball's enduring popularity stands as a testament to the enduring appeal of this ancient sport that has captured the hearts of people for over a millennium.
